New careers & Programs Information Governor Patrick visited Washington Beech to sign into

law legislation that will facilitate the HOPE VI redevelopment. In a speaking program before the signing, Governor Patrick was joined on stage by Mayor Menino, Councilor Consalvo, Senator Walsh, Representatives Honan, Rush and Sánchez, Housing Undersecretary Brooks, Boston

Housing Authority Administrator Henriquez, and WB-FFUN Committee Chair Meena Carr.

The officials expressed the commitment of state and local government

and the community at large to support the redevelopment. Several speakers spoke about the hard work and dedication of residents over the years that have made HOPE VI a reality



today. Meena, on behalf of all residents, expressed the collective resolve to preserve and strengthen the Washington Beech community and to support each of our neighbors through the transformations ahead.

While the governor's visit was one very visible sign to the broader community that HOPE VI is now a reality, Washington Beech residents have known for many months that the redevelopment is really happening. Phase One residents in particular have been working hard to finalize their plans for relocation.

With the assistance of Housing Opportunities Unlimited,they have been finding great success securing the best relocation options for their families.

Residents also continue to provide valuable guidance to the design team as they finalize the plans for the redevelopment. In late summer, a Resident Advisory Committee convened to review the architect's master plan for the new Washington Beech, and that master plan is now under review by city agencies.

The plan calls for a new 72-unit apartment building to occupy the most prominent corner of the site, at the intersection of Washington and Beech streets (depicted in the below artist's rendering). The ground floor of that building will house community spaces including a large meeting room, a computer center, a food pantry, and offices for management and residents. The upper floors will be houses with one- and two-bedroom apartments for seniors and small households. The rest of the housing on the entire site will be townhouse-style buildings of two, three, four and five bedroom apartments appropriate for larger families with individual stoops and private back yards. Phase Two will include a one-half-acre central open space with children's play equipment, a full-sized basketball court, and sitting areas for passive recreation.

We expect approval soon of the master plan, and Phase One relocation to be completed by the end of the year. You will start seeing the first buildings come down by spring 2009 and the first new buildings rising by next summer.
